2022 Capital District Midyear Kiwanis Conference

Rick Balzhiser and Ginny Grant travelled together to the 2022 Capital District Kiwanis Midyear Conference & CKI District Convention held at the Great Wolf Lodge in Williamsburg, Virginia. This event was held from Friday, March 4th through Sunday, March 6th, 2022. The weekend began with a Kiwanis International Meet and Greet Reception held early Friday evening, followed by a Fellowship Dinner held in the Grand Oak Ballroom. Immediately following dinner was a program called "Fallen Timbers," which was a very entertaining animated Walt Disney cartoon about our nation's past heroes narrated by James Earl Jones.

Saturday was the "heavy lifting" day with workshops going all day. Following breakfast the first workshop Rick attended was called "Why Membership Matters" and was facilitated by Peter Mancuso, the Kiwanis International President. The second workshop was entitled "Keeping Your Club's Seats Filled" and was conducted by Josh Hiscock, a District Trustee. Following lunch Rick attended "Recruitment Bootcamp Experience" and was run by both Area Director Rhonda Vrell and Membership Coordinator John Morris. The purpose of this exercise was to indoctrinate those present on a new membership program that is being introduced by Kiwanis International called "2 + 2." This is a recruitment program whereby two Kiwanians go out to a prospective member's home or place of business and "pitch" the Kiwanis club experience to them in an attempt to get them interested in joining a club. They had attendees pair with another Kiwanian they did not know, but pretended they have known each other for years. Rick was paired with John Montgomery, who is a Membership Coordinator for another Kiwanis club. They were tasked with "visiting" three separate prospects and trying to convince them to join Kiwanis. Sitting at the table with you was a Certified Kiwanis Membership Coach who at the end of each interview would critique you on how you did (what you did right and what you could improve on).

What was the most fun about this experiment was that the folks that were chosen to be interviewed were NOT Kiwanians and not members of any club. This turned out to be a real attempt to get them interested in Kiwanis. The last workshop of the day was strictly a meeting with John Morris and all of the Membership Coordinator's for all twenty districts that comprise the Capital District. Since Rick is now the Membership Coordinator for District 8 he was required to attend this meeting. Saturday evening was concluded with the Midyear Banquet, which ran well into the night.

The conference concluded on Sunday morning with the Farewell Breakfast followed by a project called Generosity Feeds, a meal packaging project. This is very similar to what we do for "Bright Futures" but on a much bigger scale. The entire emphasis of the conference was Membership Recruitment and Retention for both SLP clubs and CKI. The fall convention will be held in Baltimore, Maryland from August 19th through August 21st, 2022 at the Sheraton Inner Harbor. Next year's Midyear Conference is to be held in Crystal City, Virginia with dates and locations to be determined at a later date.

Amanda Holsinger gave a very informative talk about the risk of strokes, preventative care, support groups, and rehabilitation after a stroke. It is important to know that anyone at any age can have a stroke. However, there are some things we can do to lessen the risk: healthy nutrition, watch alcohol intake, exercise, and don't smoke. In addition to the physical effects of a stroke, the emotional effects can be significant for both the survivor and the family. Support groups can be a powerful help for taking care of yourself emotionally.

Nick Sabo, the Executive Director for the Winchester Airport, shared the plans for the future of the airport, including having more community space and events when the new terminal is built. Anybody can go to the airport and sit on the picnic tables or balcony and watch the numerous planes taking off and landing daily. We are fortunate to have a supportive resource in our community by providing the space for our monthly board meetings.





Amy Rice, the Executive Director for the Evans Home for Children in Winchester, discussed the important work done with children who have experienced some type of trauma in their past. These children are given a home, the resources necessary to recover, learn to trust, and work towards a positive future.


