

#### KIWANIS CLUB OF WINCHESTER VIRGINIA FOUNDATION INC.

Purpose of the Kiwanis Club of Winchester Foundation: It is a 501 (c) (3) foundation established under the auspices of the Kiwanis Club of Winchester for the purpose of fundraising and delivery of funds for local community activities, children's services for underprivileged children and their families, community projects benefiting the greater good of the health, welfare and environment, and educational support needs for children and their families.

**Responsible for the Foundation's operation:** The foundation board consisting of an Immediate Past President, President, President-elect, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer and five directors selected from the general membership of the Kiwanis Club oversee the foundation's operation.

How the Foundation differs from our club's fundraising initiatives: The annual budget for the Kiwanis Club of Winchester is designed to address limited financial needs within the Winchester area community for the current fiscal year. Those needs are referred to the appropriate committee for review and recommendation to the Kiwanis Club of Winchester's Board of Directors for approval. The scope of these recommendations is normally limited to \$500 or less. The purpose of the foundation is to develop a significant pool of funds which are available to address projects larger in scope and which will have a significant and long-term impact on the community and its children.

**Current funding level of the Foundation:** Contributions amounting to approximately \$28,000 have been received to date. The goal is to build a cash reserve of \$50,000.

**Expenditure of Foundation funds:** Individuals or organizations from the Winchester area can obtain a Financial Grant Request form online at kcowfoundation.org. All requests will be reviewed by the foundation board for compliance with the foundation's goals and the goals of the Kiwanis Club of Winchester. Priority will be given to grant requests that directly benefit children.

#### Kiwanians can participate by:

- 1. Considering a gift to the foundation as a part of their annual charitable giving. Charitable gifts should be sent to the Kiwanis Club of Winchester Foundation, Inc, Post Office Box 3243, Winchester, VA 22604.
- 2. Making a gift to the foundation in honor or memory of an individual.
- 3. Including the foundation as a recipient of funds in their estate/will planning.
- 4. Advising the foundation board of organizations or businesses that might be interested in partnering with the foundation to address specific community needs.

#### **EMOTIONAL RESILIENCE**

Dr. Cortney Warren, a clinical psychologist, recently wrote a powerful article for CNBC Make It on the topic of "Emotional Resilience" that really spoke to me, so I thought I would share it with the members that may be going through challenging times.

We all experience pain and negative situations in our life. By developing emotional resilience, we are better able to handle these experiences in a healthy way. It will take effort and practice, but while going through something negative you can remind yourself what you are grateful for and where you do and don't have control.

Use any of these phrases every single day to develop emotional resilience.

- 1. "I can get through this." Grit and perseverance are actually more indicative of success than IQ. You aren't denying reality, but recognizing reality and moving forward.
- 2. "I'm not going to let myself be a victim." Consider how you can grow and learn rather than giving up and being a victim. Giving up can lead to learned helplessness, where you end up not even trying.
- 3. "Life is hard." Yes, life can be hard. However, being emotionally resilient means you can see that life can be difficult for everyone, but it is part of the journey of life. Look for the good, don't focus on the bad.
- 4. "This, too, shall pass." When something traumatic occurs, the pain may never go away completely. Being resilient means that you can work towards making each day better. Don't look for payback or revenge, choose to let these experiences go in order to move forward.
- 5. "I still have things to be grateful for." Instead of wondering why something happened to you, think about how you can grow from this dark experience. Find ways to be thankful for the good things in life rather than focusing on the difficulties.
- 6. "I need some time." Instead of reacting immediately, a resilient person will take some time to respond or make a big decision. Sometimes in pain and anger we can strike out verbally. Take time to process the grief or pain, instead of saying something that will cause pain to someone else. I never agreed with "words will never harm me." Words can do significant damage to a person.


