



Guest Speakers

On July 9th, Ben Weber, Director of Access at Blue Ridge Independence at Home, talked about a new program in our area that supports individuals who would like to stay in their homes as long as possible. The PACE Model (Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly) coordinates care for participants. This care includes a medical clinic, dining facility, therapeutic treatments, transportation, medications, and more. PACE is a health plan for individuals 55 or older and eligible for nursing home care and helps seniors avoid the high costs of assisted living facilities. Thank you Ben for sharing about this model of care for our seniors. Having an interdisciplinary team that provides an entire continuum of care allows for a higher level of support for individuals with chronic con-

ditions as they age.





Jenny Grooms, the Executive Director for Valley Health Foundations, spoke to our club on July 17th. Her work focuses on the charitable arm of Valley Health, which is separate from operational dollars. There are six foundations at Valley Health, including: Philanthropy, Education, Equipment, and Capital Campaigns. These foundations have funded medical conferences for continuing education, raised money for the Cancer Center and the new Warren Memorial Hospital, funds a camp for children with disabilities, and supports the Hurst Hospitality House. We learned about the four Moxi robots provided by the foundation that improves patient care. The robots can be sent to

the pharmacy or take samples to the lab, allowing nurses to stay on the floor.

Thank you Jenny for educating us about the Valley Health Foundations, which improves the care of every community member.
